

Krutz 2009 "Stagecoach Vineyard" Cabernet Sauvignon, Napa Valley

Winemaker's Tasting Notes This wine has beautiful deep purple hues and

complex aromas of black cherry, licorice and tobacco leaf. Medium-plus weight leads to a beautifully structured and layered mid-palate. The flavors consist of blackberry with hints of roasted coffee bean and earthy black tea. The finish is long and lingering, with a tightly laced tannin promising great aging

potential.

VINEYARD & HARVEST INFORMATION

Vineyard Stagecoach Vineyard has become one of the

most renowned vineyards in Napa Valley. It rises from 1,200 feet above sea level to nearly 1,850 feet at its highest on the southern side of the Oakville appellation's Pritchard Hill and Atlas Peak. With southfacing slopes filled with shallow, volcanic soils, its rugged terroir is ideal for growing

intense cabernet sauvignon.
