## **Krutz 2010 “Akins Vineyard” Pinot Noir, Anderson Valley**

*Winemaker’s Tasting Notes* Earthy, spicy, and balanced. Inviting aromas of raspberry puree, green tea and plum. The entry offers an intriguing hint of smoke and peppercorns that carry through to a mid-palate filled with silky tannins and cherry and raspberry flavors. On the finish, oak-inspired overtones of coffee and baking spice mingle with leather and fruit bringing this wine to a long, satisfying conclusion.

### VINEYARD & HARVEST INFORMATION

<i>Vineyards</i>	The Akins Family Vineyard is located a bit closer to the coast just west near Philo on Highway 128. This vineyard is planted with some of the newer identified Dijon clones of 115, 777, and 667.
<i>Vineyard Elevation</i>	300 feet above sea level.
<i>Exposure</i>	South-Southwest
<i>Soil</i>	Primarily sandy loam and adobe soil.
<i>Block/Clone</i>	Dijon clones 115, 777, and 667
<i>Harvested</i>	October 12th, 2010

<i>Blend</i>	100% Pinot Noir
<i>Fermentation</i>	5-day cold soak, then tank-fermented on the skins for 21 days.
<i>Alcohol by Volume</i>	14.4%
<i>pH</i>	3.71
<i>Cooperage</i>	50% new French oak barrels
<i>Barrel Aging</i>	14 months
<i>Release Date:</i>	July, 2013
<i>Production</i>	250 cases
