Winemaker's Tasting Notes A beak offers a bouquet of red cherries,

clove, and strawberries. Plum, cedar spice, cheery, and vanilla oak layers dance as the weight builds and the finish lingers.

VINEYARD & HARVEST INFORMATION

Vineyard Roma Vineyard is atop a ridgeline of 1,800

feet in elevation and is planted with all Pommard clones. Absolutely stunning views from here, as the fruit takes on the coastal breezes from the Pacific, located near the town of Booneville. The Akins Vineyard is located a bit closer to the coast just west near Philo on Highway 128. This vineyard is planted with some of the newer identified Dijon clones of 115, 777, and 667. It is for this reason I chose to homogenize the two vineyards for a nice expression of Anderson

Valley.

Vineyard Elevation Roma Vineyard is 1,800 feet above sea level,

and Akins Vineyard is 400 feet
