VINEYARD & HARVEST INFORMATION

Vineyard In recent years, Stagecoach Vineyard has

become one of the most renowned vineyards in Napa Valley. It rises 1,200 feet above sea level and continues to climb to nearly 1,850 feet at its highest elevations on the southern side of the Oakville appellation's Pritchard Hill and Atlas Peak. Blessed with southfacing slopes filled with shallow, volcanic soils, the site's rugged terroir is ideal for

growing intensely colored syrah.
