Winemaker's Tasting Notes Striking aromas of black cherries, dark red

berry preserves, toffee, and toast. Delicious with a medium-plus weight, crimson and ruby color, and a core of perfectly ripe black cherries, black raspberries, mocha, cedarspice, and black tea. Great tension on the palate with a big, spicy, fruit-laden finish that lingers. Oak-derived flavors will integrate

and mellow over time.

Vineyards The Akins Family Vineyard is located a bit

closer to the coast just west near Philo on Highway 128. This vineyard is planted with some of the newer identified Dijon clones of

115, 777, and 667.
