Krutz 2010 “Krupp Vineyard” Malbec, Napa Valley

Winemaker’s Tasting Notes

A very deep, rich and balanced expression of our Malbec. Notes of violets, mountain sage, and flint fill the nose. On the palate, rich notes of blueberry jam, boysenberry, and fennel are all framed with a sweet cedar spice. The tannins are long, refined, and somewhat dusty, accentuating the flavors in the finish.

VINEYARD & HARVEST INFORMATION

<i>Vineyard</i>	The hunt to find an unrivaled vineyard source for our Malbec led us high into Napa Valley’s eastern hills to a harsh mountain site, strewn with rocks and choked with chaparral, which straddles Atlas Peak and Pritchard Hill. The coolest of the three vineyards Jan Krupp farms, Krupp Vineyard’s hilly terrain, cool nights, and well-drained soils provide a longer, fuller growing season for early-ripening Malbec.
